

## Introduction

The incidents that prompted me to write this book were twofold: my close-up sighting of an unconventional craft in an area that presupposes potential danger to our national defense; as well as my reading of Nick Begich's *Angels Don't Play This HAARP*, which describes a government research project that manipulates weather over predetermined regions of the earth.

Believing that there was a possible connection between my sighting and the research project, I began to theorize that present severe weather anomalies have been purposely initiated, out of necessity, to prevent extraterrestrial craft or unidentified flying objects (UFOs) from monitoring areas of our planet.

Reports of UFOs have engendered derision, emotion and misinformation over the last fifty years, dissuading many people from divulging their sighting observations. The decision to disclose my sighting was especially difficult; nonetheless, the proximity of the unconventional craft to a strategic defense base convinced me that it was necessary.

To learn more about UFOs, hopefully, from a technological viewpoint, I reviewed the current literature. Fortuitously, *Unconventional Flying Objects, A Scientific Analysis*, by Paul R. Hill, a former NASA scientist, was one of my selections. Hill summarizes UFO sighting reports collected over twenty years while working at NASA, for the purpose of scientific examination. He thoroughly and concisely analyzes craft details and their characteristics. The book is an exemplary scientific study of UFO phenomena.

His analysis convinced me that unconventional (unidentified) craft, as well as space-time travel, were consistent with present scientific principles, thereby supporting the possibility of alien visitations to our planet. The craft I viewed might well have been of extraterrestrial origin.
